If you need to be seen quickly and cannot wait for a next available appointment at the surgery, but you <u>do not</u> have life-threatening illnesses or accidents, you can 'walk into' these centres and see a GP. No appointment needed.

Eye Care

Lambeth Lewisham and Southwark Minor Eye Conditions Scheme – This self referral service allows patients to access NHS treatment for a range of eye conditions. Instead of having to visit hospital for treatment, you can now be seen by a highly trained optometrist based in a local optician's practice. The aim of the scheme is to allow all patients to be able to access treatment quickly, near where you live and work. Appointments are often available within two days, and many of the practices offer appointments at weekends.

For participating practices simply go to this address page http://www.lslloc.org/ then click on the 'minor eye conditions scheme' tab on the right of the page selecting 'participating practices'.

If you have a red eye, a sticky eye (difficulty opening your eye or yellow discharge), a watery eye (excessive tears), pain or discomfort in or around the eyes, or recent onset or sudden increase of flashes of light or floating objects in your vision this service is suitable and you can self refer.

If you are unsure whether your eye problem requires medical attention, please call one of the participating practices who will be happy to advise you.

If you are suffering from significant pain, a sudden loss of vision in one or both eyes, chemical burns or a penetrating injury then you should seek Emergency eye care.

Pregnancy and Gynaecological care

Weekends and bank holidays: 9.30am - 3.15pm This is a nurseled, specialist unit for women who need emergency care for a problem of early pregnancy (up to 18 weeks into), such as pain, bleeding or severe vomiting. They accept self-referrals and provide a walk-in, so you do not need an appointment.

For pregnant women who are 18 + weeks pregnant and booked into Guys and St Thomas. should attend the ADU if:

- your baby is less active than usual
- your blood pressure is raised or there is protein in your urine (the midwife or GP will spot this)
- you are having severe itching during pregnancy
- you think your waters may have broken
- you have an urgent problem such as vaginal bleeding or abdominal pain
- you are having labour pain (contractions).

Please note if you are pregnant with any antenatal concerns such as reduced baby movement, bleeding or abdominal cramps and your preferred service is not available to please attend your local A+E at your local hospital promptly as obstetric care is accessible via A+E.

Please do leave a message and a contact number. An answerphone service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The answer phone service is confidential. A member of staff will get back to you as soon as possible; this may be the next working day if you ring after they close. They are happy to ring mobiles and they do not leave messages saying they have called.

Sexual Health

For quick contraception and general sexual and reproductive health advice and treatment for men and women of all ages, including young people under 16 you can visit the following centers. The School health Service offers a weight management programme to children aged 5 to 12 who are resident or attending any state school in London Borough of Lewisham. The weight management programme called MEND.

- -Safeguarding: assessing and promoting the health needs of vulnerable children
- -Early intervention: includes giving support and advice on issues that can impact on emotional health and well-being for example bullying & peer pressure

- -Sexual health advice
- -Enuresis (bedwetting) clinic aged 7-16 years
- -Immunisations HPV, Meningitis ACWY vaccination & teenage booster, flu vaccination for primary school years one and two as well as Human papilloma virus vaccine (HPV) for girls in year 8.

No recourse to public funds helpline - Call us on 07963 509044

No recourse to public funds (NRPF) is a condition imposed on someone due to their immigration status. Section 115 Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 states that a person will have 'no recourse to public funds' if they are 'subject to immigration control' for example those who are on a student visa, visa overstayers or have an indefinite leave to remain as the adult dependant relative of a person with settled status etc.

Housing issues

You do not need a Doctor's letter. If the council requires your medical information they will request your written consent and write directly to your doctor in confidence to provide the required medial information.
